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### ***2017-2018 HomeSchool Support Program***

Homeschool students must submit an [Online Application](#) for the first year that they participate in the Support Program (\$25 application fee applies toward your first activity). Reenrolling students, may submit the Reenrollment through their [ParentsWeb](#) account for the 2017-18 school year (\$10 reenrollment fee applies toward your first activity). The application or reenrollment should be completed prior to the first event in which the student chooses to participate.

Once an application for a student has been completed to play sports, parents may call the school office to add additional programs in which the student chooses to participate throughout the year. All fees will be billed through our online FACTS management system, for which parents are required to register upon enrollment. When choosing your student's grade level at the beginning of the application, please be sure to choose the "Homeschool Application Packet" to avoid being overcharged.

#### **ACADEMIC PROGRAMS**

- Elementary Art– *Grades K-6*
  - Elementary Art will meet once a month, on dates to be announced from 8:50-9:50am. K-2<sup>nd</sup> grade will meet on a different week, on the same day, than 3<sup>rd</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> grade, in order to provide age-specific instruction.
  - The 2017 Elementary Art program will be Drawing Basics. Class time will include a time of instruction on the technique being covered, after which students will complete a project.
  - The cost for Elementary Art is \$35 per student, or \$50 for more than one student.
- Elementary Music – *Grades K-6*
  - Elementary Music will meet according to the arranged schedule. Involvement in Elementary Music will be separated into the fall and spring programs.
    - The fall program will include practice and participation in the Veterans Day program in November, as well as participation in the National Anthem at a Cleveland Monsters hockey game.
      - Practice times will be announced. Practices are once a week, and students should begin to attend by mid-September in order to participate.
      - Extra practices and dress rehearsal will be scheduled as the program date approaches.
    - The spring program will include practice and participation in the Spring Musicale in March.
      - Practices times, similar to the fall program, will be announced. Students should attend no later than mid-January in order to participate.
  - The cost for Elementary Music is \$50 per program per family (\$100 per year).

- Concert Choir – Grades 7-12
  - Concert Choir will meet according to the arranged schedule. Involvement in Concert Choir will be separated into the fall and spring programs.
    - The fall program will include practice and participation in the Veterans' Day program in November.
      - Practice times will be announced. Practices are once a week. Students should attend no later than mid-September to participate.
      - Parts cd's will be sent home with students for extra practice, and extra practices and dress rehearsal will be scheduled as the program date approaches.
    - The spring program will include practice and participation in the Spring Church Concert Series (usually at least three Sunday concerts), and the National Anthem at the Cleveland Cavaliers game (dates tba).
      - Students should attend no later than mid-January in order to participate.
  - The cost for Concert Choir is \$50 per program per family (\$100 per year).
  
- Standardized Achievement Testing
  - K-12<sup>th</sup> grade students are administered the [Terra Nova](#) achievement test, using the Terra Nova 3 Complete Battery plus Bible in the early spring, usually the first week of April.
  - \$40 per student
  - Achievement testing participants who are not participating in other Homeschool Support Programs are not required to file an online application. Signups will be held prior to testing via email, phone, the school office, or area Homeschool Coop groups. - Mini Electives – Grades 7-12
  - Mini-electives modules are educational enrichment courses which, when combined together, can be used for elective credit, at the high school level and/or fine arts credit at the junior high level.
  - Individuals wishing to teach mini-electives modules at FBCS should apply by calling Mr. Tim Spickler at the school office.
  - As an example, the 2016-17 Mini-elective offerings are listed on the table below. Click on the link for each course for a course description. A schedule for the 2017-18 mini-electives is currently being created during the hours of 1-3pm two or three days per week in the areas of Home Economics/Skills, Fine Arts, and Physical Education. Average modules are priced at \$15 each, or the whole course (one semester) may be taken for \$225 per student. On a minimal basis, some modules are more costly, based on the materials needed for instruction.

**SPORTS PROGRAMS** (Please see also the FBCS Athletic Manual for more details and information)

Sports at the Junior High and Varsity levels are offered for a fee of \$200 for the first sport and \$150 for subsequent sports the same school year per student.

- Intramural Basketball (Grades 3-6)
  - Basic basketball training is offered for boys and girls on coed teams. Players are split into at least four teams, two days a week, for instruction and competition. It utilizes volunteer, usually parental, coaches and Varsity basketball players.
  - Intramural basketball usually takes place in the spring after regular basketball season ends and lasts about six weeks.
  - Intramural Basketball is offered for a fee of \$15.
- Soccer (Grades 6-12)
  - Varsity level coached by Kevin Quick and Jon Casbohm
  - Soccer is scheduled as a boys program, but girls are able to participate.
  - When participation demands, soccer will be split into JH and/or JV and Varsity teams.
- Girls' Volleyball (Grades 6-12)
  - Varsity and Junior Varsity levels coached by Matt Goodrich; JH coached by Samantha Iler
- Boys' Basketball (Grades 6-12)
  - Varsity level coached by Darren Snelling; JH coach to be announced
  - Junior high and Varsity levels are currently offered. When participation demands, Varsity boys' basketball will be split into JV and Varsity teams.
- Girls' Basketball (Grades 6-12)
  - Varsity level coached by Jeff Rising; JH coached by Jenn Meng
  - When participation demands, girls' varsity basketball will be split into JV and Varsity teams.

## **OTHER PROGRAMS**

- Elementary Field Day (Grades PreK-6)
  - Elementary (K through 6<sup>th</sup> grade) students will enjoy a fun and educational day filled with physical activity and games on September 23 from 9am-2:45pm.
  - Field Day participants who are not participating in other Homeschool Support Programs are not required to file an online application. Signups will be held prior to the event via email, phone, or in the school office.
  - Kindergarten students should be picked up early at 11:30am
  - \$5 per student will include all activities.
  - Students are asked to bring a sack lunch.
- Celebrate Elyria Community Day
  - Enjoy a fun time with small carnival games and activities on October 7, 2017.
  - Admission is free of charge; tickets to participate in games are \$0.25 each, with most games costing between 2 and 3 tickets.
  - Event is open to the public.
- Carnival Booth Management (Grades 7-12)
  - Gather a group of friends to run one or more Carnival booths to raise money for your group at the Community Day on October 7, 2017. At least one student participating must be enrolled in the Homeschool Support program.
- High School Play (Grades 7-12)
  - Tryout for cast positions (usually grades 9-12) or work on the crew for our Spring Play, the first weekend in May.
  - \$10 per student, who must have an online application on file.
